






Political Animosity, U.S.

Figure 1: Partisan Feeling and Affective Polarization Overtime (ANES)









Political Animosity, International

Figure 1: Trends in Affective Polarization by Country


























#### **ACTIVE LISTENING**



Listening nonjudgmentally, constructively

- •••
- Examples: smiling/head nodding, thanking person for their perspective, finding common ground for agreement, holding back before giving opinion



Conveys respect, builds empathy and positive feelings







#### PERSPECTIVE SHARING



Give one's perspective, ideally through a personal story



Examples: Explaining a personal experience that impacted your views, explaining the environment in which you grew up



Builds empathy, understanding, and respect







#### MORAL REFRAMING



Connect your views to the values of the other person



Examples: With conservatives, connect to patriotism, family values, religion, tradition. With liberals, connect to equality, social justice, protecting vulnerable groups.



Is persuasive, conveys respect



#### Typical arguments in favor:

"the law requires that all citizens be treated equally and have the same opportunity to pursue happiness"

"legalizing same-sex marriage is the only fair course of action in a country founded on the principle of equality"

## Reframed arguments in favor:

"same-sex couples are proud and patriotic Americans"


"they share the same basic hopes and desires as all Americans"

"like other proud Americans, gay couples peacefully build lives together, buy homes, and contribute to the American economy and society"


























#### HARM MESSAGE

- The result is barren soil across the world, making it harder to produce food, resulting in famine and starvation.












## BLAISE PASCAL, **PENSEES** (1669)
